

- Privacy of coaches and players
- Personal safety for coaches and players
- Protection of Club name? How are you going to do this?
- Damage to image of a particular sporting code &/or local club
- Using a club/sporting code logo? Permission? From who?
- Posting photos of players on personal sites?
- Codes of Conduct – include use and misuse of technology by players/participants, parents and coaches
- Make sure it is widely circulated in both electronic and printed form
- Obtain signed acknowledgements from parents / players / coaches
- Make it a useable policy with valid statements
- Seek expert advice promptly and when necessary
- Acceptable use, inappropriate content, coaches socialising with players on facebook????  
Coaches texting players in a social arena?
- Guidelines for technology use
- Reporting processes
- Develop adequate (real working policies) that address all potential problems, circulate and **enforce**.

Revise these policies regularly

- Do not think that young players cannot be involved in inappropriate & criminal online behaviors
- Cyberbullying/online harassment etc is not 'age appropriate'
- Primary Schools are now encountering behaviors never before seen at that level
- Cyberspace has no boundaries – it is just one big world that everyone has equal access to
- Sports Administrators, Coaches, Players and Parents must be made aware of the potential dangers of participating in unsafe online practices including the legal considerations and be empowered accordingly.
